## **The PEACE PLUS Programme- Rural Communities**

The PEACE PLUS Programme is a €1bn investment in the social, economic and environmental development of Northern Ireland and the border counties of Ireland.

Building upon the success of previous cross border PEACE and INTERREG Programmes, it will contribute to a more peaceful, prosperous and stable society, leaving a lasting legacy across the Programme area. This will be achieved by funding activities that promote peace and reconciliation across six themes, which encompass 21 individual investment areas as outlined below. These have been developed to optimise engagement and participation across all ages, communities and sectors.



A public consultation regarding the potential PEACE PLUS Programme design was held in 2019-20. In response to the views expressed, the SEUPB has developed the Programme to ensure multiple opportunities for engagement by **Rural Communities**. These include a dedicated measures (4.2 Rural Regeneration and Social Inclusion), and other areas, which although not exclusively for rural communities, will provide significant opportunities for sectoral involvement (Themes 1,2, 3, 5 and 6) as outlined below.

We now look forward to receiving your views on the investment areas proposed as part of the Statutory Public Consultation process, and wish to outline all the areas across the Programme which may provide opportunity for you to get involved, and initiate the preparation of potential projects.

## **Theme 4: Healthy and Inclusive Communities**

Rural Communities have a vital role to play in the creation of a more peaceful and prosperous society. Hence, this Theme includes a dedicated measure to enable rural communities to adopt a strengths-based approach to thrive and reach their full potential through economic, social and environmental interventions.

Projects and activities associated with the **PEACE PLUS Rural Regeneration and Social Inclusion Programme** will increase the level of sustained interaction between people from different community, cultural and political backgrounds in rural communities, thus contributing to the creation of a more peaceful and prosperous society.

Theme 1: Building Peaceful and Thriving Communities

1.2 Empowering	This investment area will support the delivery of people-to-people projects in rural	
Communities (€30m)	communities by local Community & Voluntary Sector organisations. Through the	
	provision of a small grants programme, it will enable participation by smaller	
	organisations who can often be best placed to affect real change and embed peace at	
	local community level. Projects can use any medium which will result in improved cross community relations. Projects will facilitate collaborative approaches by the	
	statutory, community and voluntary sectors, designed to address anti-social	
	behaviours which undermine peace and reconciliation. In this way, the Programme	
	will contribute to the creation of strengthened and more cohesive local communities	
	and provide significant opportunity for engagement by rural communities.	
1.3 Building Positive	This investment area will provide support for projects which transcend local	
Relations (€30m)	boundaries and have the potential to achieve significant peace and reconciliation across the Programme area. It will present opportunities for Community & Voluntary	
	Sector organisations with the capacity to deliver large, strategic peace and	
	reconciliation projects, including those involving rural communities.	
1.4 Re-Imaging	This investment area will offer the potential to develop new and transform existing	
Communities (€60m)	spaces into shared environments for use by all communities. It will provide	
	Community & Voluntary Sector organisations with the opportunity to develop and	
	manage innovative spaces, including those within rural communities, which contribute to improved peace and reconciliation. These shared spaces will span a	
	range of thematic areas including: children and young people; health and wellbeing;	
	social enterprise, education; arts and culture; tourism and heritage; and sport and	
	recreation.	
Theme 2: Delivering Economic Regeneration and Transformation		
2.3 Programme Area	This investment area will support area-based approaches to address emerging skills
