Project Case Study: The Positive Impact of Causeway Coast & Glen's PEACE IV Action Plan

Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Councils Local Authority Action Plan was diverse in terms of activity, delivery method and the participants that it engaged with across the Borough. It was delivered under three core themes: Children and Young People, Building Positive Relations and Shared Spaces and Services.

Among numerous outputs the Action Plan helped to:

- Provide 34 upgrades to existing community facilities throughout the Borough;
- Facilitate the participation of over 200 people in the Shared Spaces and Services Programme;
- Engage approximately 1,140 Children and Young People in a range of leadership, activity-based and visual arts programmes;
- Deliver a range of programmes that helped build good relations and community capacity through the Community and Cultural Institutions Programme;
- Delivered a significant Cross-Border Programme that built a sound foundation for relationships to continue to develop and prosper into the future; as well as the revelation of the importance and abundance of local history and heritage, with a wealth of heritage being uncovered.
