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CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE (£658,427.12): This strand of the action plan aims to deliver a series of activities that will enhance the capacity of children and young people to form positive and effective relationships with others of a different background and make a positive contribution to building a cohesive society. Five projects have been approved (see Council website for details).

BUILDING POSITIVE RELATIONS (£1,362,225.42): This strand of the action plan aims to deliver activities that will result in meaningful, purposeful and sustained contact between persons from different communities. Seven projects have been approved (see Council website for details).

SHARED SPACES AND SERVICES (1,112,501.69): This strand of the action plan aims to create a more cohesive society through an increased provision of shared spaces and services. Two projects have been approved (see Council website for details).
