Project Case Study: Peace and Conflict Transformation Project (PACT)

PACT is an innovative assured training project designed to promote peace and reconciliation for women across Northern Ireland and the Border Regions of Ireland.

The project has created a forward-thinking online tool, which was developed by Queen's University and Training for Women Network. Foyle Women's Information Network and Intercomm are responsible for the co-ordination of cross-community and cross-border training sessions of participants.

This project will be the first PEACE project to use specific tailored training coupled with cross-community and cross-border training venues.
