Project Case Study: Lifestart Foundation: Shaping Ourselves & Our Children (SOOC)

The SOOC Project is an innovative, inter-generational project aimed at promoting reconciliation and good relations by addressing the site where human values and social attitudes are initially formed and shaped—the Home Learning Environment, where the parent is key.

SOOC aims to support parents of young children to create a home conducive to good child social and emotional development, inclusiveness and a respect for social and cultural diversity.

Working in cross-border collaboration, the project will deliver 240 interactive SOOC parenting programmes within nine areas:

- Derry/Londonderry
- Tyrone
- Fermanagh
- Ards Peninsula
- The Border Counties of Ireland
- Donegal
- Sligo
- Leitrim
- West Cavan

“Positive feedback and observations from parents are evident from all the SOOC courses that have been run in Leitrim. Engagement has been very good from the groups and interactions between members have improved over the duration of the course, with open and honest conversations evident. Most parents pledged to make a conscious effort to build better relations with others and embrace difference, so as their children would more easily foster good relations with people despite diversity.”

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To date, the project has been delivered to 952 parents, grandparents and childcare educators, and approximately 1,752 children.

Evaluative data on impact indicates significant changes in: parental attitudes and behaviours; communication; and on parenting practices.

The project is being delivered through interactive sessions, each lasting four hours, delivered once a week, over four weeks to groups of parents, grandparents and childcare educators in this region.

It is aimed that approximately 2,880 parents and their children will benefit. Families will be from the Protestant; Catholic; Black; Minority; and Ethnic backgrounds.

The Lifestart Foundation aims to make the project stimulating and innovative; build upon parental strengths; challenge values, attitudes and behaviours; and support shared learning, personal change and self-esteem. The aim is to make the project available to as many families in the Border Region as is practically possible.
